

One of the most appreciated aspects of Azar's work is how she teases out the primary sources available (diaries, letters, postcards, and rare photographs) by providing contextual support. In other words, the reader learns much about Tatiana's world as well as the Grand Duchess' own thoughts and experiences. Through Tatiana's lens readers gain new and welcome insights. I was especially struck by how her words convey both a certain pride in her role as family "governess," advisor/supervisor, as well as that role becoming a burden at times. For the first time, I think I understand who she really was, and why. highest recommendation to all who love Imperial Russian history.
